Experience in the assessment of damaged buildings after the Homeland War, many years of cooperation with the City of Zagreb's Emergency Management Office in the field of earthquake risk assessment and reduction, recent experience in assessing damage to buildings after the devastating earthquake in Albania – these are all our potentials that we now need and can focus on addressing the effects of the earthquake as effectively as possible.
