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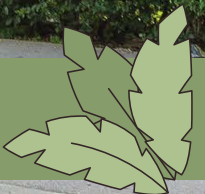

Institutional profile

The Faculty of Civil Engineering of the University of Zagreb is the oldest civil engineering faculty in Croatia, with active lectures starting in 1919 under the Technical College. Since then, it has continually developed and advanced higher education, scientific research activities and overall education, and actively participated in the development of the profession and the implementation of new technologies. The Faculty has a valid ASIIN international accreditation and, furthermore, extensive experience in research, educational and networking projects. Our vision is to retain and strengthen the leading position as a civil engineering faculty and scientific research centre in the country, to achieve international recognition by developing a culture of exemplary quality higher education and research work by implementing the best European and worldwide practices, and to retain and strengthen cooperation with the business sector in high-expertise areas and development projects, specialised life-long higher education programmes, and in the development of an alumni network for mutually beneficial support and progress.

Programme emphasis

Faculty of Civil Engineering currently offers university education at undergraduate (>900), graduate (>400) and doctoral (>90 students) levels in all branches of civil engineering. The undergraduate study programme is a three-year university undergraduate study of civil engineering with 180 ECTS credits awarded leading to the degree Bachelor of Science in Civil



Engineering. The accomplished learning outcomes upon the completion of the undergraduate study programme are acquiring and applying knowledge and understanding, making informed judgements and choices, communicating knowledge and understanding through teamwork, and developing capacities for continuous learning.

The graduate study programme is a two-year university graduate study of civil engineering with 120 ECTS credits awarded leading to the degree Master of Science in Civil Engineering. Students expand their civil engineering knowledge in one of the following career-oriented studies: geotechnics, hydro engineering, hydraulic engineering, structural engineering, construction materials, construction management, transportation engineering, theory and modelling of structures and sustainable construction and earthquake engineering.

The Doctoral study programme is a three-year university postgraduate study of civil engineering with 180 ECTS credits awarded leading to the academic title of doctor of science in the field of technical sciences, area civil engineering.

Career prospects

Civil engineers apply acquired skills and knowledge in designing, building, inspection, and maintenance of structures, infrastructures, and systems in their specialised area with regard to the issues of stability, safety, occupancy, environment protection, and costs. They recognise, formulate, and analyse the problems and find acceptable solutions in their specialised field.

Language

The study programmes in Civil Engineering are conducted in Croatian, but courses are adapted in English for incoming students. 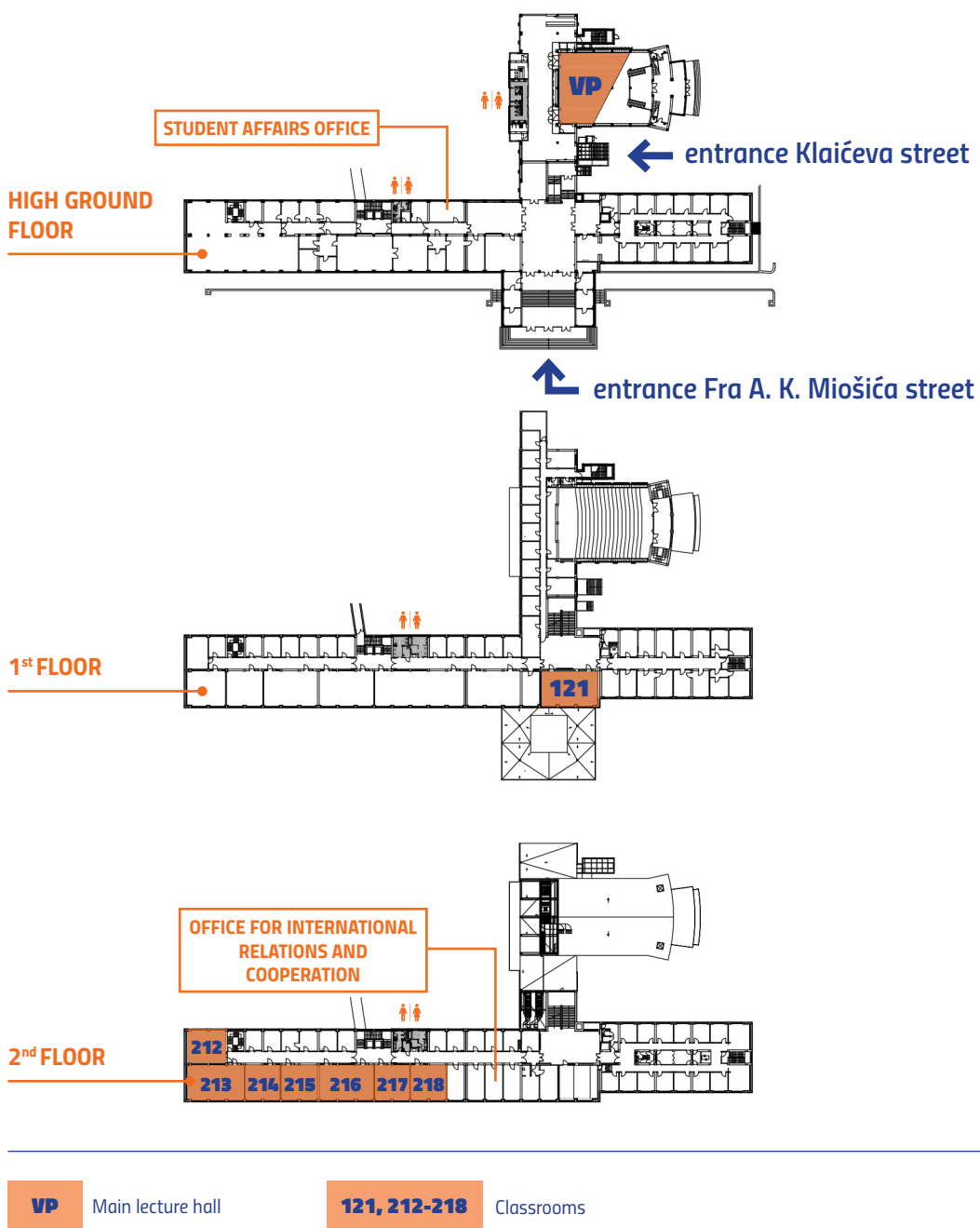




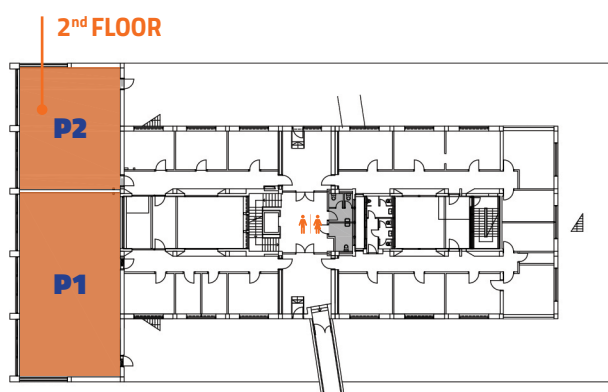
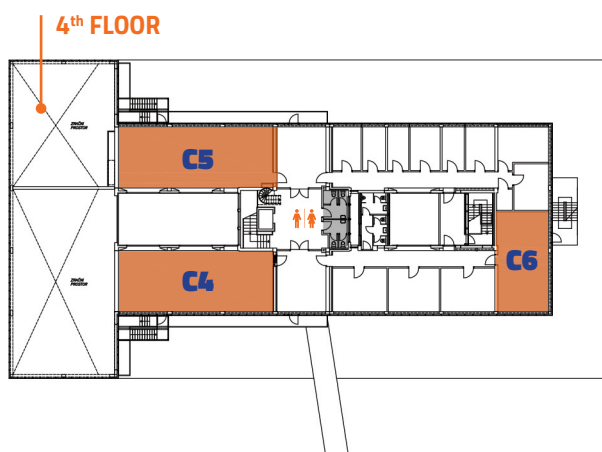
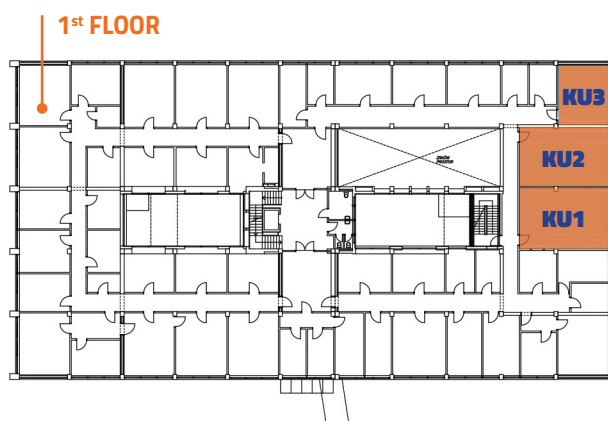
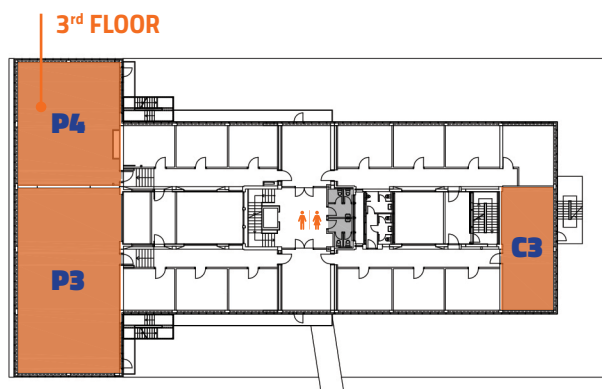
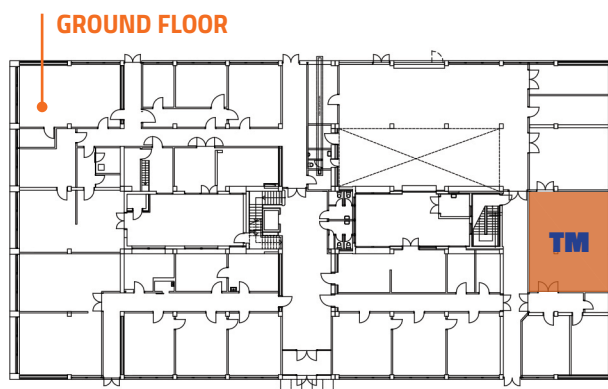
Floor plan of the faculty building

COURTYARD BUILDING



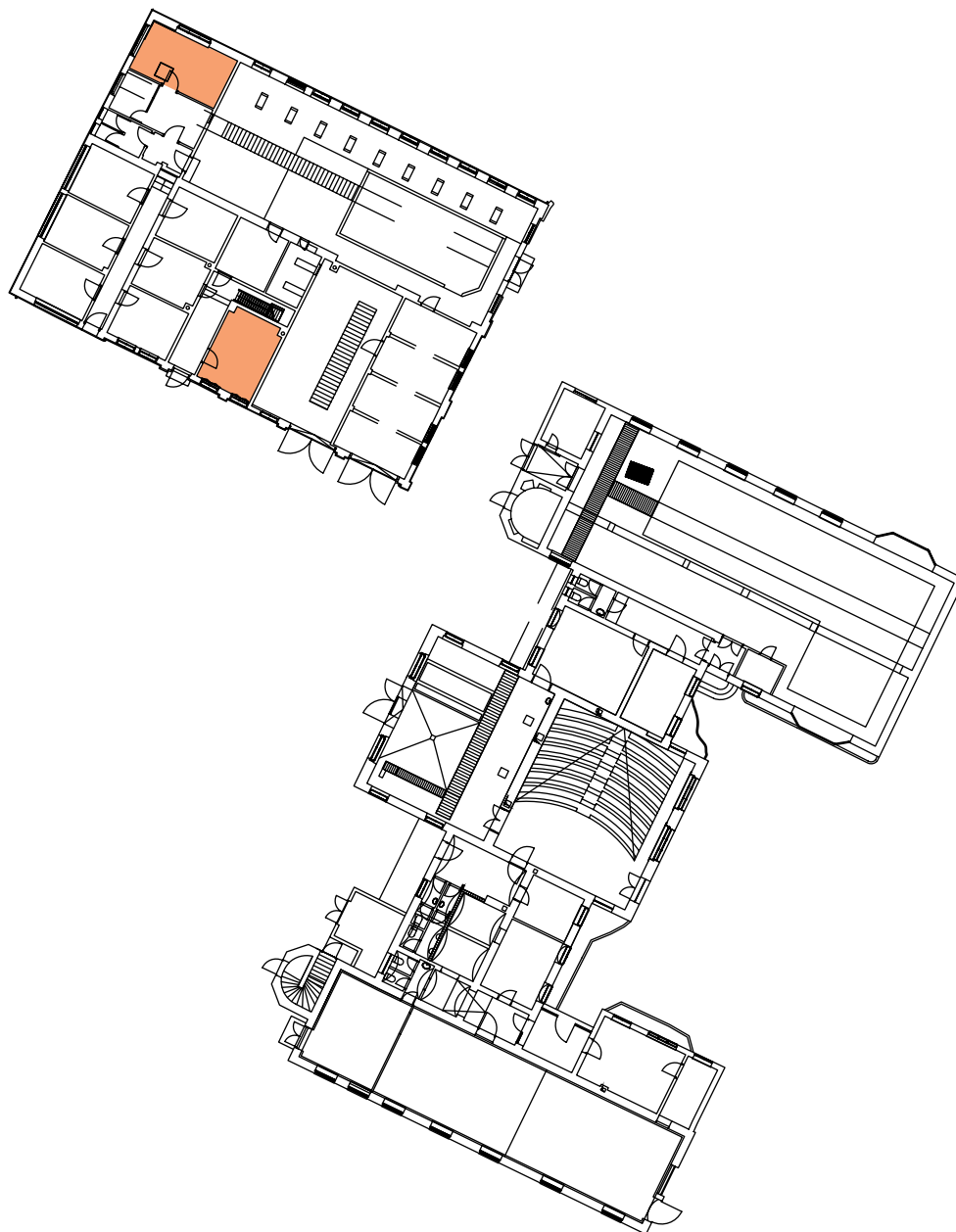
P1-4 **C3-6** **TM** Halls **KU1-3** Computer labs

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Before coming to Zagreb

Please read the relevant information about visas, residence permits and health insurance on the [University of Zagreb's webpage](#).

Personal identification number (PIN/OIB)

The Republic of Croatia introduced the Personal Identification Number PIN (OIB) in the Croatian legal system.

Assignment of PIN (OIB) is obligatory, as it is an identifier in the entire Croatian public administration system.

Required documents to obtain your PIN (OIB):

- Personal data (copy of ID or Passport)
- Info about both parents
- Filled out [application form](#)

The Application has to be submitted in person and PIN (OIB) can be issued immediately free of charge.

Issuing of PIN (OIB):

- The [Tax Administration office](#) (in Croatian) closest to your residence

Enrolment at the Faculty of Civil Engineering

Student service - Student Affairs Office

Upon enrolment

JMBAG – Academic Citizen's Unique ID Number

The Academic Citizen's Unique ID Number (JMBAG) is a unique identification number assigned to every student upon enrolment at a higher education institution in Croatia.

Student ID card (X-Card)

All Croatian students receive an X-Card (student card) upon their enrolment.

The X-card serves as a Student Identification Document which contains your student ID number (JMBAG) and enables you to have subsidised meals at student restaurants, entrance to libraries and other University premises.

Student account (@AAIEdu) – electronic identity

Electronic identity (also known as digital identity or e-identity) in the AAI@EduHr system is a set of data about an individual used for identity verification (authentication) and access rights (authorisation).

The Faculty of Civil Engineering issues the electronic identity.

Enrolled courses

ECTS coordinator

Student

Students contact course lecturers (preferably by e-mail) for details on how the classes of the enrolled course will be held.

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Registering temporary stay at the competent police administration/station for the purpose of University studies

[Registration of the temporary stay in the Republic of Croatia](#) for more than 3 months is obligatory.

Temporary stay

EEA nationals who intend to stay in the Republic of Croatia for more than 3 months are obligated to register their temporary stay (**Form 1b**) at the competent police administration/station according to their place of stay, no later than 8 days following the expiration of their 3-month stay.

When registering their stay, they have to provide a copy of a valid ID or travel document (which will be certified by an authorised officer after comparing it with the original), documents depending on the purpose of their stay, proof of health insurance, proof of sufficient means of support and proof of accommodation.

A certificate confirming that an EEA national registered his/her temporary stay is printed out of the information system **free of charge**.

Certificate of registering temporary stay for EEA nationals for the purpose of university studies

EEA nationals will be issued a registration certificate if they have a valid ID or travel document and if they submit:

- proof that they are enrolled at a higher education institution in the Republic of Croatia, have arrived as part of the student exchange based on inter-university agreements (Invitation letter issued by the University of Zagreb)
- a statement on having sufficient funds to support themselves and their family members so that they would not rely on the social welfare system during their stay in the Republic of Croatia
- health insurance
- **[Filled out 1b form](#)**
- **[Filled out 16a form](#)**
- **Proof of secured accommodation** – The proof of secured accommodation is obtained upon arrival directly from the landlord

Public transportation

During your studies in Zagreb, you will probably use ZET trams and buses frequently. As a full-time student, you are entitled to a discount on a monthly public transport pass.

The pass is a personalised card containing your name, surname, and photograph.

To obtain the pass, you need to complete an application form and provide one photograph measuring 3 × 3.5 cm.

To receive the student discount, you need to:

- fill out the application form available on the ZET website
[ZET Subscription Card Information](#) (In Croatian)
- have the completed form certified by your faculty's student office
- submit the completed form and one 3 × 3.5 cm photograph at a ZET sales office

The card issuance fee is €3.98 and is paid when submitting the application.

Accommodation

Exchange students coming to Zagreb may choose between organised accommodation in one of the three student halls of residence or a private rental. The University of Zagreb does not guarantee student accommodation. Students who wish to apply for accommodation in the student halls of residence must submit an application. The housing request form is included in the general online application form for exchange students. **As the number of beds available for exchange students is limited, vacancies are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Number of buildings: 12 pavilions

Capacity: over 4,000 beds

Facilities: fitness centre, cinema hall, classrooms, pastoral office, medical and dental clinic, dance hall, two student restaurants, a pizzeria, café and pastry shop.

CVJETNO NASELJE

Location: Odranska 8

Number of buildings: 8 pavilions

Capacity: over 1,800 beds

Facilities: fitness centre, classrooms, medical and dental clinic, multifunctional hall, two student restaurants, café and pastry shop.

Special feature: pavilion specially adapted for students with disabilities.

DR. ANTE STARČEVIĆ (commonly known as “Šara”)

Location: Zagrebačka avenija 2

Number of buildings: 3 pavilions

Capacity: more than 1,200 beds

Facilities: sports and recreational activities (fitness, table tennis, aerobics, zumba), outdoor sports courts (football, basketball), party room.

DEADLINES TO APPLY FOR STUDENT ACCOMMODATION:

- 15 May for the upcoming academic year or winter semester
- 15 November for the upcoming summer semester

IMPORTANT: Housing request forms received after the deadline will NOT be considered.

FOREIGN STUDENTS IN THE INTERNSHIP MOBILITY PROGRAMME MUST CONTACT THE COORDINATORS FOR INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AT THE UNIT WHERE THEY APPLIED FOR THE SMS.



Private accommodation

Students who are not staying in student residences will need to consider alternatives such as private rental accommodation.

Rents vary greatly depending on location, room size, and facilities. Overhead expenses are sometimes included in the price, and sometimes paid by the tenant. Payment is usually expected at the beginning of the month, although some landlords request payment for several months in advance. The best way to find accommodation is to search for different offers on the following web portals. Some of these portals are only in Croatian, but they usually have photos of apartments and contact emails so you may send an enquiry.

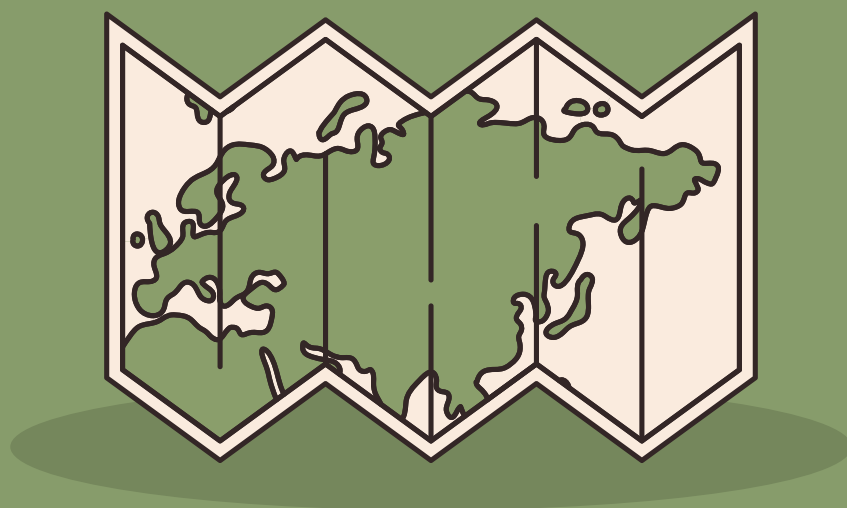
